Longitudinal System Analysis (LSA)

LSA provides HUD and Continuums of Care (CoCs) with critical information about how people experiencing homelessness use their system of care. The LSA is replacing the Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR).

The AHAR is a national-level report that provides information about homeless service providers, people and households experiencing homelessness, and various characteristics of that population.

LSA includes:

- Demographic characteristics like age, race, gender, and veteran status;
- Length of time homeless and patterns of system use;
- Information specific to populations whose needs and/or eligibility for services may differ from the broader homeless population, such as veterans, people and households experiencing chronic homelessness, and others; and
- Housing outcomes for those who exit the homeless services system.

Longitudinal System Analysis (LSA)

LSA includes:

- Demographics: Adults Only, Adults and Child, and Child Only
- Programs: ES, SH, TH, RRH, and PSH
- Reviews: DV status, chronically homeless and disabling conditions, living situation residence type, destination
- System Engagement: 1st time homeless, Return from PH, temp destination, continuously homeless, and unknown destination
- Geography: City, Suburb, Rural, and unknown
- Length of Time Homeless

AHAR includes:

- Demographic: Family, Singles, and Vet
- Programs: ES singles, ES fam, TH single, TH fam, PSH singles TH fam, Vet ES singles, Vet ES fam, Vet TH single, Vet TH fam, Vet PSH singles, and Vet TH fam
- Destination
- Living Situation
- Length of Time Homeless

Partners for HOME Performance Update

- Partners for HOME is continuing to work toward program level performance dashboards.
 - These dashboards will be available to view by quarter on the Partners for HOME website.
 - The dashboards will be interactive and intuitive.
 - We are in the process of developing Client Track performance reports that will enhance our performance reporting capabilities.
 - These reports should be available in the coming months.
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Partners for HOME Performance Update

- The initial dashboards will show anonymous project level performance data for permanent supportive housing and rapid rehousing programs.
- The dashboards will expand to report data for emergency shelter, transitional housing, Home First projects and system level measures.
- New performance measures will be tracked when available with our expanded reporting.

HomeFirst Investments

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TANF Rapid Rehousing: \$1.2M investment

- Partnership with Chris180 and PCCI
- Temporary, flexible subsidy + services
- Serve/house 100 homeless families per year
- \$500K TANF + \$620K HomeFirst
- First investment of TANF funds from State
- Recent renewal Year 2 contract + Wells Fargo Lift award

Donna Center

- Low barrier shelter for single women and intact families
- Opened Q2, 2018
- Operated by Mary Hall Freedom House

Weaver Gardens

- 14 units low barrier emergency shelter for intact families
- Repurposed existing facility owned and operated by Families First

Evolution Center at Jefferson Place

- Renovated Fulton Co facility at Jefferson Place
- 75 beds low barrier shelter for men; 25 more coming online 9/18
- Long term lease with County

Viewpoint

- Permanent Supportive Housing services for 97 former Pine shelter residents
- Paired with AH Choice vouchers

Next Up

Ending Family Homelessness by 2020



Diversion:

- Evidenced based approach to diverting families from homelessness utilizing a problem solving technique and flexible one-time funds*
- Paired with eviction legal defense
- Partnership with AVLF; leverage of Annie E Casey investment and potentially, Purpose Built Schools
- Place based: NPU-V to start and Carver Cluster

*Homeless to Housed in a Hurry. Extending the Use of Diversion to help families exit homelessness.

Ending Chronic Homelessness by 2019



Led by the PSH Pipeline Committee:

PFH, Atlanta Housing, Invest Atlanta, Enterprise Community Partners, City of Atlanta and Corporation for Supportive Housing

- First ever: Braided funds, single application, with AH, for both public and private investment: Capital, operating and services
- To develop 550 new units of PSH for chronically homeless singles and families
- Grant funds/gap financing
- Application release imminent

Outreach

- 7 FTE's including a licensed clinician to expand outreach capacity
- FLOW housing specialist
- Coordinated entry support
- RFP released/open now

Ending Youth Homelessness by 2020



Host Home

- Temporary and medium term interim/transitional housing for 18-24 with supportive families
- LGBTQ youth focused
- RFP released/open now
